Physical and Digital Education In Year 6 Caoimhe



Message from the Centre for Disease Control Northern Territory


The Centre for Disease Control in Darwin has advised an increase in the diarrhoeal illness cases in the Northern Territory. There has been a 40% increase in the diarrhoeal illness cryptosporidiosis 'crypto', since January 2023 with **most cases being in kids under 5 years of age (ie. child care age)**

All childcare centres are therefore being urged to follow the following rules to prevent further transmission:

- 1. Anyone with diarrhoea should not attend childcare/school until there has not been a loose bowel action for 24 hours. People with diarrhoea should not prepare or handle food that will be eaten by others.
- 2. Anyone with cryptosporidiosis should not swim, wade, or paddle in public pools for at least 2 weeks after the diarrhoea has resolved.


