## At SPPS we aim to ensure that the right people have the right information at the right time!

Due to this, the school council with the school leadership team have reviewed our communication approaches and listened to feedback received from families. The review showed that:

- •Only 80% of families access the schoolstream app and some families state will never access the app.
- •Preschool and Transition use the Seesaw App at a class level and have had to follow two apps to receive information.
- •100% of families share an email address upon enrolment.

So, from the beginning of Term 3, we will be discontinuing our use of the schoolstream app.

- All orders are linked directly to the school for submission to Scholastic. Books will be delivered to your child's classroom if you order by the close date.

You can still order the old fashion way by sending orders to school with cash. Please make sure orders are filled out correctly and placed in an envelope or small bag, so the money doesn't fall out. Please don't sticky tape money to the order as this makes it very difficult to read. Your help in these matters would be appreciated.
















# What's Happening in HASS?
















# Palmerston Bus Interchange School drop-offs and pick-ups
