



















Multiplication Stretegies in Year 4 Wang

Students in 4AW investigated multiplication strategies through group work and hands-on materials in Week 1. Teaching multiplication strategies empowers students to solve problems and carry out calculations with confidence and understanding.

It is important for students to work with maths facts in a hands-on way as they build their understanding. Students in the photos put hands-on materials in arrays to see how and why the doubling and halving strategy work in multiplication, then tested this strategy by working with their peers to solve complex problems.
