# **Book Fair Next Week!**

The library will be holding its annual Book Fair next week, Monday 28th August to Friday 1st September. This is an opportunity for you to purchase books and assist the school. Depending on sales, the library can earn 10% - 35% of the total sales in books.

This week, your child will have an opportunity to preview the Book Fair during their library time. They will bring home a pamphlet and a wish list with a selection of books they are interested in.

If you would like to view or purchase books with your child, the Book Fair will be held in the Library and will be open for sales Monday 28th August to Friday 1st September from 7.45am - 8.05am before school and after school 2.30pm – 3.00pm for students with an adult.

Students in Year 3-6 can come to the library at recess time to buy books on their own.




# **SPPS Preschool Enrolments Open**
