From the Principal...

Each year Northern Territory schools identify areas for improvement and determine actions that will help them achieve specific goals. Stuart Park's focus has been on developing data literacy of our staff and building consistent curriculum delivery across the school. We are pleased to say that we have been successful in both and continue to improve in these areas.


Another focus has been improving reading outcomes. This focus was chosen using a range of assessment data with our progress including:

- -Implementing an evidence-based whole-class literacy program from Preschool to Year One providing all children with the essential core knowledge and strong foundations to become successful readers and writers. This program is called Initialit.
- -Developing a Year Two reading approach that provides additional staff to work alongside teachers and students for four hours per week allowing for small group work and instruction targeted to student needs. This approach also includes an expert teacher working with students achieving close to or above the expected level in reading.
- -Introducing Cars and Stars, a comprehensive diagnostic and instructional reading comprehension program from Year 3 to Year 6.

We did commence our Year Two reading approach in 2022 and are pleased to share that our 2023 NAPLAN data this year reflected strong results with over 3/4 of students being at the exceeding and strong levels in reading. We look forward to sharing more stories of NAPLAN success in our next newsletter

Year 3 Evans have been busy learning about subtraction and its link to addition.

We always start off our maths lesson with a warmup activity or number talk. Then we often take a walk down memory lane and link our learning to any prior knowledge.

To begin our unit on subtraction we modelled subtraction using our MAB blocks and place value mats. Once we understood how to manipulate subtracting with MAB blocks, we were then ready to put our learning into practice and transfer this into writing vertical subtraction sums. We started our unit with no regrouping and now we are super clever and learning to subtract with regrouping!!!

Audrey- It is taking away a number.


Lachlan-You can solve subtraction vertically.

Free home-based assessment and treatment for

7 to 12 year old children with fear and anxiety disorders.

Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services

- A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with a trained psychologist via the telephone;
- Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or tablet; and
- Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidencebased treatments available for helping anxious children.

About the treatments

Each treatment involves your child completing treatment sessions at home on a PC, laptop or tablet.

Each treatment involves your child learning practical strategies to better manage anxiety.

- One treatment helps children learn to control the focus of their attention on helpful things around them.
- The other treatment helps children learn to think differently and approach things they fear.

Each treatment includes information, telephone or email support for parents in assisting their child to better manage anxiety.

Prior studies have shown that children who complete each treatment experience significant reductions in anxiety.
