

In Week 6, we had a short play in the playground with our buddies so we could get to know each other. I In Week 7, we spent 2 hours on Thursday morning doing an orienteering activity and rotating through each of the Year 3 and 3/4 classrooms, doing mini activities with our buddies. The orienteering activity required us to search and find a poster with a picture on it in each of the listed areas of upper primary. 
