

From the Acting Principal...

Road safety around our school is essential to safeguard the well-being of not only students, but all members of our school community. Drivers are required to reduce their speed to 40 km/h in school zones and remain vigilant at school crossings, being prepared to stop for children who may be crossing or intending to cross the road.

When parking around the school, please use only designated legal parking areas and avoid obstructing traffic and our neighbour's driveways. When using the angle parking on Ashley Street, please avoid making U-turns during drop-off and pick-up times as this is dangerous and can contribute to traffic delays.

The Bree Stop is designated as the drop-and-go zone at SPPS. Parking is prohibited here between 7:30-8:30 a.m. and 2:15-3:15 p.m. If you need to visit the front office or canteen, please utilise the designated parking zones (not the staff car park) to ensure smooth traffic flow and enhance safety.

When collecting children in the afternoon, please wait until 2:40pm as this gives us time to load our school buses and get them on their way. Always avoid overtaking in our drive through area and be patient as we work through the afternoon pick-ups.

We all lead busy lives. Often, we are in a hurry, running late for work or distracted by what is going on in the car. But nothing is more important than the safety of our most vulnerable and inexperienced road users, our children.

So give yourself a little more time in the morning/afternoon, so you don't have to feel rushed. Teach the kids to exit the car carefully, away from traffic and to cross at the designated crossings. Be patient with other road users and considerate of our neighbours who live around our school. And please—slow down when you're in a school zone.


